


An unforgettable African experience

Cameroon, an African country on the gulf of guinea renowned for the famous Lord Derby Eland. The hunting in Cameroon is categorised into two main areas namely forest and savannah.



ACCOMMODATION

The various concessions have well equipped camps ranging from VIP forest camps such as Boumba North which are regarded as the best for buffalo and more rustic camps. The accommodation promises to be comfortable. All camps are built in the style of traditional West African safari camps, with thatched huts, either round or rectangular – depending on the local building style, all with private bathroom and toilet, together with huts.

The outfitters have striven to build in attractive locations, either by a river, or on a good view point, so you can always observe the rich animal and bird around the camp. Catering is of a very high standard, and the atmosphere in camp is very relaxing. Occasionally you will spend a few days in a socalled fly-camp, if the hunt for a particular species is carried out far from one of the main camp

CLIMATE AND CLOTHING

Forest – At least three complete dark green hunting outfits and a light raincoat are recommended. Leather gloves, leggings and glasses to protect you from vegetation and insects. Two pairs of Gore Tex hunting boots and one pair of light shoes for the camp. Gore Tex socks are recommended.

Savannah: A couple T-shirts, long trousers for hunting and shorts for staying at the camp, good boots and during the early season, a light coat for the early morning. We have daily laundry services at the camps.

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

Getting to Cameroon:

There is a daily flight from Paris to Douala. There are two flights per week from Brussels to Douala/Yaounde or from Paris to Yaounde. Once in Cameroon one has a choice between a few possibilities.

Getting to camp:


Savannah Camps - Domestic flights from Douala/Yauunde to Garoua or ngoaundere a city about 239km from the camps which means four hours driving

Forest Camps - Either a Charter flights from Douala to Lokomo or a two day drive from Doula to camp.

HUNTING SEASON

The savannah season goes from Christmas to mid-April, with the best time for eland in the early season.

The forest season goes from April to end-July, with any time being good as this is the rainy season
